

MORNING MEETINGS IN OSLO



EXPLORE OSLO

Our afternoons will be free to explore the area. Oslo, the capital and most populous city of Norway, was founded as a city at the end of the Viking Age in 1040 under the name Ánslo and was established as a kaupstad (market center or trading place) in 1048 by Harald Hardrada. It's true that Oslo has many museums. Luckily for you, the ones you shouldn't miss are all in one place: the Bygdøy Peninsula. Think about checking out the Kon-Tiki Museum—to see Thor Heyerdahl's raft that took him across the Pacific Ocean.

If you would like to eat at the Norwegian three-starred Michelin restaurant, Maaemo, you must plan ahead—possibly even three months in advance. Lastly if you are going to have a drink in Oslo, you may want to make it a cocktail at Himkok, since it was named one of the world's top establishments by The World's 50 Best Bars.



TRAVEL FROM OSLO TO BERGEN

On Wednesday, we move from Oslo to Bergen. Make sure to book your flight or train. Please note that Ken and Kay will be taking the train (booked on Rail Ninja) on Wednesday at 12:03 p.m. to head to Bergen.

The Oslo to Bergen train takes about 7 hours and is a real rail adventure with soaring views of villages, fjords, rivers, and the Norwegian countryside.

ADVENTURE AWAITS IN BERGEN

We will continue on Thursday and Friday with our morning meetings from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 Noon in Bergen, Norway at the De Bergenske- Grand Hotel Terminus with afternoons free to take in the sites. The most iconic sight to greet you to Bergen is the colourful Bryggen, the old 14th century Hanseatic wharf, named a Unesco World Heritage site. Bergen is very much known for the fjords surrounding it, and there are several cruise companies eager to show you the wonders of the famous Norwegian coast. In addition, Bergen is known as the city of seven mountains, so it seems only natural that you may want to visit one. The most easily accessible is Fløyen, which can be reached by a funicular and take you to the top of the mountain in less than eight minutes. You will then have the option to take the funicular back down or enjoy a beautiful walk down the mountainside.

In connection with the National Exhibition in Bergen in 1928, the city received its own Grand Hotel. This hotel has definitely lived up to its name, and it is one of the city's most luxurious places to stay. The Directorate for Cultural Heritage in 2012 also listed the hotel as an remarkable example of modern hotel architecture of the 20th century.

The Grand Hotel Terminus collection renamed Bar Amundsen, must also be mentioned as it was the last place Roald Amundsen, polar explorer, held a press conference before disappearing without a trace in the barren Arctic in an attempt to save his fellow explorer, Umberto Nobile. The bar is best known today for its award-winning whisky collection and as a place where noble deeds combine with noble spirits.
